



Trinity Sunday focuses on God as community. God is the Lover (Father), the Beloved (Son), and the Love which flows between them (Holy Spirit). The love of the Trinity makes God completely one.

We may well wonder at times if we might be missing out on something important in our Christian experience? Did you ever feel that the Christian life has to be about a lot more than a difficult struggle to try and lead a good life as if it all depended on me, on my will and my power. If we feel that there's a distinct lack of joy and enthusiasm in our lives and that we have never found something in our Christian experience that we want to shout from the rooftops, then what we are really lacking is a direct encounter with the Holy Spirit. The Spirit that Jesus promised wasn't poured out as a kick-start to get the infant church up and running. It was always part of the divine plan that every believer who accepted Jesus Christ as Lord of his or her lives would be filled with that same Spirit. The Christian life is by definition a life of union with Christ lived in the power of the Spirit. Rather than being about will power it is about my will, yes, but working in conjunction with the power of the Spirit.

Christ spoke to his followers of the danger of looking to each other for approval and neglecting the approval that comes from being true to themselves and doing God's will. There is a big difference between approval and support. To support someone is not necessarily to approve of their actions but it is to be there for them no matter what they may have done. A young person on drugs needs the support of his parents to break the addiction. It doesn't mean that they condone the behaviour, or even are prepared to share the same house with the addict. The Bible teaches in Proverbs that a friend deserves support even if he or she has forsaken the Law of the Most High. Christ took support from Simon of Cyrene when carrying his cross. Simon didn't carry it for him, but he did lend support. It is with support that we can get through most things in life. The need for approval is a form of addiction that diminishes us while support empowers us to become our best selves.
